The Fundamentals of Acting (RTF FIG) introduces the fundamentals of acting to freshman Radio-TV-Film majors. Directing 1 is the study and practice of the fundamentals of stage directing: composition/picturization, working with actors and production collaborators, text analysis. Intro to Creating New Media introduces student actors to strategies for growing as generative artists using the tools and platform of new media.
